





making a thread loop by hand

METHOD 1

THREAD CHAIN

Thread needle and knot ends.

1. With knot on wrong side, bring needle up through fabric to outside and take a stitch close to base of thread. Pull up thread to form a loop, keeping thread separate with thumb and fore finger.
2. Bring needle thread through loop, forming a new loop.
3. Drop first loop and pull new loop tight.
4. Repeat until thread chain is long enough to go around button.
5. Then bring needle through loop and pull tight.
6. Attach end of chain to garment with a small stitch and knot. Bring thread to wrong side and knot again.







METHOD 2

BUTTONHOLE LOOP

Thread needle and knot ends.

1. With knot on wrong side, bring needle out on right side of fabric where loop with start, back in where loop will end and back out at the starting point, forming a loop.
2. Repeat this step until you have the desired number of threads to form the thickness of the loop. (This will depend on the thickness of chosen thread.) Fasten thread off.
3. With a new single strand of thread, knot one end and begin at starting point and work Left to Right. Cover loop with blanket/buttonhole stitches.
4. To make a blanket stitch, insert needle through loop and over thread. Pull up thread and repeat, sliding stitches snugly together. Knot and fasten thread off at end.

making a thread loop by machine

METHOD 1

STANDARD SEWING MACHINE

1. Cut 4 to 6 strands of thread a little longer than the length needed to form the loop.
2. Bring up the bobbin thread of the machine.
3. Pull threads together with the top thread and the ends of the strands behind and under the presser foot.
4. Zig zag stitch over the threads.
5. Attach machine made thread chains by threading ends through large eye needle. Pull ends to wrong side and knot.



METHOD 2

SERGER SEWING MACHINE

1. Set serger up to do a rolled hem.
2. With the presser foot down, stitch, forming a thread chain, to the desired length.
3. Attach machine made thread chains by threading ends through large eye needle. Pull ends to wrong side and knot.
